Good news from Powerhouse inquiry

It's been clear from the start that the Powerhouse move isn't about creating the best possible museum in Western Sydney, it's about ripping off the public by letting property developers snatch up land in Ultimo. Yesterday we got another opportunity to unpack the government's decision with the latest in a series of Powerhouse inquiry hearings at Parliament House.

It was encouraging to hear that the government hasn't formalised its commitment to move the Powerhouse and in fact the Minister said there will be no contracts committed to until after the state election in March 2019.

This is great news and gives us more time.

It's clear that this inquiry and the swell of community support behind it have slowed the government's plans. Now we need to make this a high profile issue in the run up to the state election to ensure whoever wins government will not go ahead with this destructive policy.

I remain totally committed to safeguarding the Powerhouse at its true home in Ultimo and delivering a world class facility for western Sydney
