Update on the planning process



The largest cultural investment since the Sydney Opera House, Powerhouse Parramatta will be the first state cultural institution located in Western Sydney – in Parramatta, the geographical heart of Sydney.

As part of the design development and in response to submissions received during the Environmental Impact Statement assessment process, a series of changes have been made to Powerhouse Parramatta.

Overall, the changes improve the surrounding public spaces, create a better arrival experience and enhance connectivity from the Civic Link to the riverfront, enriching the overall visitor experience.

An Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) was developed earlier this year as part of the State Significant Development Application for Powerhouse Parramatta.

The Environmental Impact Statement was on exhibition from Wednesday 10 June to Tuesday 21 July 2020. Over 1,300 submissions were received during the exhibition of the State Significant Development Application.

We would like to thank everybody who has provided feedback on the project to date.

Infrastructure NSW has now reviewed all the submissions and a Response to Submissions Report has been prepared. The report addresses the matters raised in the submissions and also outlines changes made to the project as a result of the feedback received.
